Genesis 12:1-4 God's Promises:

National: Make him a great nation: Deut 28:12-13. Jewish nation to also become eternally great: Joel 3:20. Personal: Blessed by sins forgiven and eternal life: Acts 3:25-26. Make his name great: Matt 8:11; Isa 51:1-3 Family: Bless those who bless him: Forgiveness of sins and eternal life to Abraham's seed: Gal 3:8-9,14,29. **International:** Bless all nations through Abraham. Christ's righteous rule: Isa 2:2-4; Psa 72:1-4,17-19. Knowledge of God: Hab 2:14. No more hunger: Psa 72:12-13. Final fulfilment at end of 1000 years: Rev 21:1-7.

God promises the Land of Canaan to Abram's Seed, Jesus Christ:

One Seed: Christ, Gal 3:16. Seed as Many: If we are baptised into Christ then we are Abraham's seed and heirs according to the promise: Gal 3:29; Gen 15:5.

Abram's first call at Ur: Acts 7:2-5.

Abram's family were originally idolaters: Josh 24:2 Abram left Ur not knowing where he was going: Heb 11:8 Abram and family left Ur and journeyed to Haran: Gen 11:31 God's call to Abram is our call: Rom 8:28

Abram's Second call at Haran: Gen 12:1.

Abram is then further enlightened by the gospel: Gal 3:8; Gen 12:3. Abram responds to God's invitation and crosses the Euphrates. He becomes known as "Abram the Hebrew" (crosser over): Gen 14:3

The Promises confirmed Unconditionally: Gen 22:16-18

Because Abraham did not withhold his only son Isaac, God swore by Himself that the promises made to him would come true.

The Life of Abraham:

Ur: Acts 7:2-3: Heb 11:8. Called out not knowing where he was going.

Haran: Gen 12:2-3. North of the River Euphrates. Shechem: Gen 12:6. After crossing the Euphrates.

Between Bethel and Hai: Gen 12:8. Calls upon the name of Yahweh.

Egypt: Gen 12:10 Low point in Abraham's life.

Between Bethel and Hai: Gen 13:3-4 Abraham calls upon Yahweh.

Mamre: Gen 14:3; Gen 18:1 Angels appear to Abraham and Sarah.

Gerar: Gen 20:1 With Abimalech king of Gerer. Beer-Sheba: Gen 21:31-34 Covenant with Abimalech.

Moriah: Gen 22:1-2 Commanded to offer Isaac.

Beer-Sheba: Gen 22:16-19 Promises made unconditionally.

Hebron: Gen 28:1-4 Promises also made to Isaac.

Canaan: Gen 17:8. unto the LORD.

Seven Promises to Abraham:

Gen 12:1-3 Points to the ultimate fulfilment of God's purpose.

Gen 12:7 The Land promised first to Abram's seed - Christ.

Gen 13:14-17 The Land promised to Abram once the three conditions of the first are met.

Gen 15:13-21 The captivity and salvation of Abram's people and the cutting of a covenant - Abram's seed are guaranteed possession of the Land from the Euphrates to Nile.

Gen 17:4-8 Yahweh's fatherhood is given to Abraham and he is promised a Divine family.

Gen 17:15-16; 18:10,14 The promised seed - Isaac, to be born within 12 months.

Gen 22:16-18 Promises made unconditional to Abraham (see Heb 6:13-18). Proceeded by covenant with Gentiles where 7 ewe lambs were offered (Gen 21:22-32). Concludes in Gen 22:18 "in thy seed shall all nations of the earth be blessed"

Key New Testament Verses:

Acts 7:5 Abraham did not receive the land as an inheritance.

Rom 15:8 Christ came to confirm the promises to the fathers.

Gal 3:8-9 The Gospel was preached to Abraham. Faithful believers will be blessed with faithful Abraham.

Gal 3:14-16 Jesus Christ is the Seed through whom we obtain salvation. We become part of God's family.

Gal 3:26-29 Importance of Baptism into Christ. Heirs of the promise are those who are given an inheritance by God.

Heb 11:8-13 Abraham died in faith not having received the promises. He therefore needs to be resurrected in the future.

Heb 11:39-40 Abraham died without receiving the promises. When he receives them in the future, we are a part of them!
